# **Sophomore Year Checklist:**

- Take PSAT in October
- Start a planning Calendar with goals and deadlines
- Volunteer at Church or School
- Attend College Fair/Events on campuses
- Take ACT
- Explore careers and job opportunities in interested careers.
  Consider "job shadow"
- Start creating a resume and keep it updated
- Meet with Mrs. McLaughlin about goals, career aspirations, and schools you are considering



### **Junior Year Checklist:**

#### Fall

- Take PSAT (This one is for NMSQT)
- Research College Programs
- Attend ACT/SAT Tutoring if desired
- Build relationships with teachers for recommendations
- Continue building your resume with co-curricular activities and volunteer activities

# Spring

- Take ACT or SAT
- Research admission criteria for top schools
- Create "brag/cheat sheet" for recommenders
- Look at summer programs at colleges of interest
- Update resume
- Schedule one or two College visit days
- Have a short list of three colleges
- Explore career options and job opportunities in those careers



### **Senior Year Checklist:**

### Summer

- Take ACT/SAT in June and/or July
- Find out what standardized tests that may be required by the college. SAT Subject tests?
- Write and/or edit college essays. Have someone review your essays
- Attend college fairs
- Update resume
- Request letters of recommendation

# Fall

- Apply early for admission.
- Request transcripts from counselor
- Request test scores from ACT and/or SAT websites
- Complete scholarship application
- Explore careers
- Complete FAFSA most scholarship programs require this to be completed before awarding scholarships – Opens October 1st
- Go on college visits

# **Spring**

Continue applying for scholarships

- · Review scholarship offers with counselor
- Make a decision before May 1st
- Submit deposits (tuition and housing) to your college
- Submit housing application
- Inform other colleges of your decision
- Get familiar with college attending
- Know your scholarship application deadlines many are in January of your Senior year
